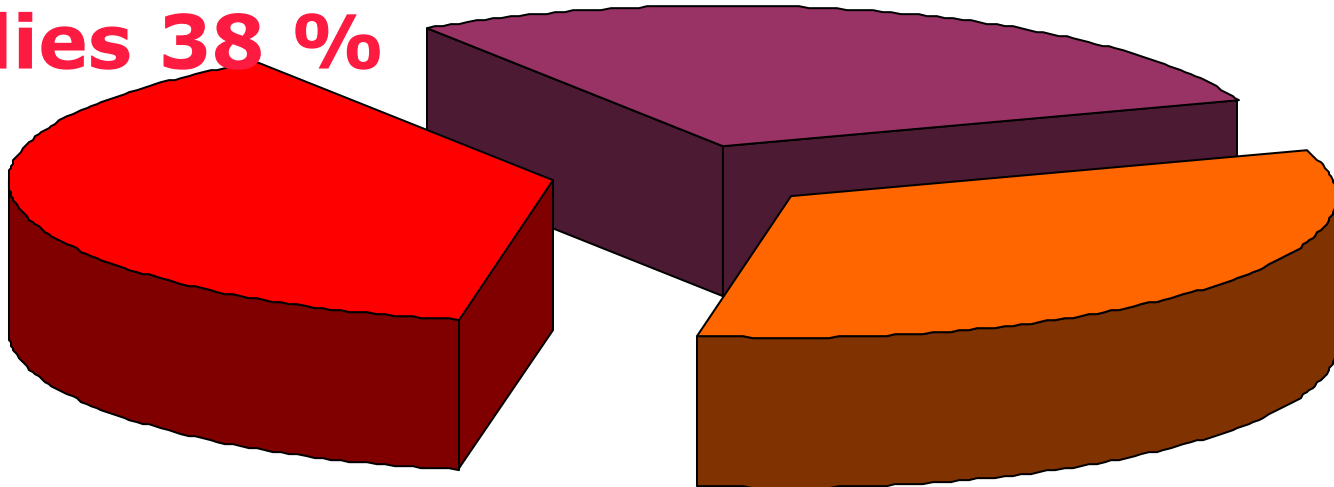

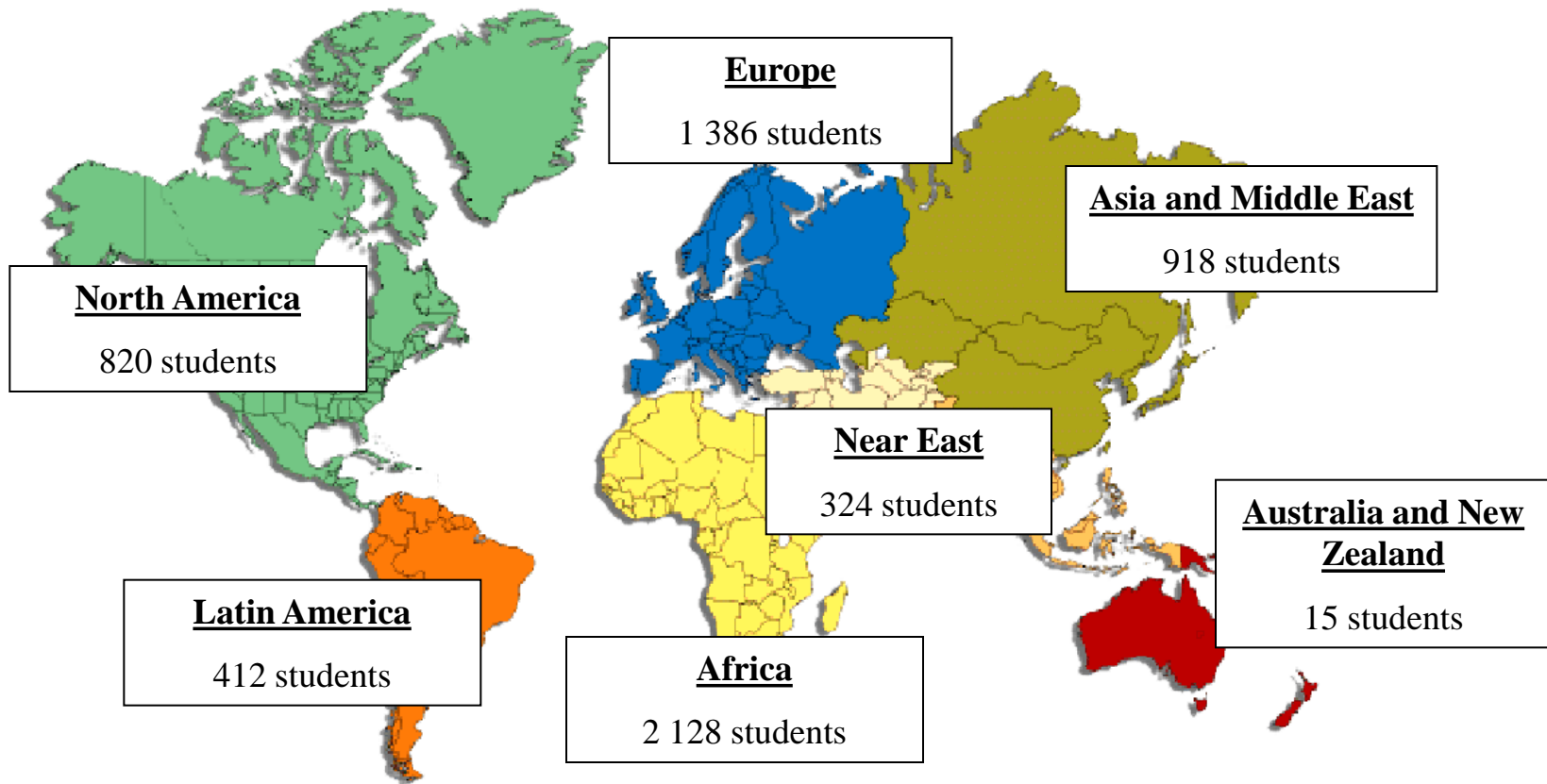
Worldwide and growing international collaborations in all disciplines, both in teaching (undergraduate and graduate levels) and research (PhDs, post-doctoral)

- 388 international agreements with universities outside Europe
- 445 ERASMUS agreements
- 6003 international students (23%), of which 1226 through exchange agreements. 4777 individuals

International strategy

- Develop international attractiveness and set up innovative disciplinary and interdisciplinary programmes with a selected number of international partners worldwide:

- joint and dual degrees,
- joint PhDs,
- joint research projects

- Engage in mutually beneficial and sustainable collaborations, both in teaching and research, to enhance and support competitiveness rather than competition



- Encourage and fund student and staff mobility

- Improve the quality of international student integration (visas, accommodation, French language support, credit transfers, etc.)
