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About the European Master in Children's Rights



- ❑ Established through a curriculum development project which was funded by the European Commission
- ❑ 3 Semester long Master program at Freie Universität Berlin
- ❑ Aim: enabling students to implement children's rights on an international, regional, national or local level and preparing them for work in organisations and projects supporting children's rights
- ❑ Large network of partner universities, projects and institutions such as the German Institute for Human Rights or Save the Children

The European Network of Masters in Children's Rights



- The ENMCR is bringing together universities and institutions dealing with children's rights
- The network is operating on a European level and is also linked to the Latin American Network of Masters in Children's Rights
- The network brings together academics, researchers, NGOs, public agencies and students

- Development and implementation of a postgraduate diploma program on Public Policy and Child Rights (DPPCR) in four universities in Egypt and Jordan.
- In cooperation with partner Universities from Egypt, Jordan, the Netherlands, the United Kingdom UNICEF Egypt and UNICEF Jordan.

Dual Degree



The Idea:

- ❑ Students enrol at one university in the first semester (e.g. FU Berlin)
- ❑ Continue the program at another partner university in the second and / or third semester
- ❑ They finish with a "dual degree" of the two universities

- ❑ Currently, this model is only available for Freie Universität Berlin, Germany and Universitatea Babeș-Bolyai in Cluj-Napoca, Romania

Dual Degree with BBU



- ❑ Two year program at BBU in Cluj-Napoca, Romania (120 ECTS)
- ❑ Slightly different focus:
 - Module example: Children and Childhoods in (Post-)Communist Societies or Children and Violence
- ❑ Exchange of students so far:
 - 2007-2008 → 2 incoming students
 - 2008-2009 → 2 incoming students
→ 1 outgoing student
 - 2009-2010 → 2 outgoing students
 - 2010-2011 → 2 incoming students
 - 2011-2012 → 1 outgoing student
